

# BOB BEATTIE POSTGRADUATE RECOGNITION AWARDS

## CONTRIBUTION EXAMPLES

The Nomination Form requires you to talk about a contribution(s) your nominee has made to an individual or to the postgraduate community in part, or as a whole.

The Bursary Awards & Scholarships Committee (BASC) is willing to consider any contributions an individual has made that meet the criteria.

Below is a list of examples of potential contributions an individual could have made. This list is not exhaustive and should only serve as a starting point:

- Has organised, or contributed to, a successful event for postgraduates, whether this be academic, personal, or welfare-related
- Has supported a fellow postgraduate student during their time at Keele in some way through personal contribution
- Has organised peer-to-peer support channels in person, or virtually to ensure cohorts/communities stay connected.
- Has shown significant kindness and generosity to fellow students (e.g., shared resources)
- Has overcome hardship or personal challenges
- Has made a significant contribution to student life at Keele
- Has been involved in postgraduate representation/advocacy e.g., PGT or PGR representative
- Has been involved in representation of postgraduates in the local community – acting as a role model, promoting education etc.
- Has volunteered to help the local community
